A. Admitted Foreign and German Athletes:

The TOP 15 of the Rolex Rankings No 111 (max. 5 per nation).

B. Admitted further Foreign Athletes (up to a total number of approx. 20 athletes):

1. Further foreign athletes who are invited through their home NF (minimum 7 NFs);
2. The FEI has the right to nominate two foreign athletes

C. Admitted further German Athletes (up to total number of approx. 30 athletes):

1. German athletes of the DOKR Champions, B and not B2 cadre 2010 jumping
2. Up to two German Juniors/Young athletes nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
3. Up to 4 athletes holding performance rating S 1 or 2 of the cadre 2010 of the regional association Bayern, who on proposal of the regional association and in agreement with the organizer will be nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
4. Up to a total number of approx. 30 German athletes
German athletes either nominated by the federal trainer jumping or personally invited by the organizer to the following ration: per 4 athletes nominated by the federal trainer jumping one athlete can be personally invited by the organizer.

Number of horses per athlete:

Per athlete 3 horses of 7 years or over. Plus 1 horse (7 or 8 years old) in classes 7-9. Horses, which are ridden in the youngsters-tour may not be started in any other competition of the event.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

One groom per rider.

VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

A) ATHLETES

Athletes may reserve hotel rooms in the official event hotel at special terms. Reservations must be made by the athletes themselves. Settlement will directly be made with the hotel.

Athletes will receive free meals (breakfast + one meal per day) from 22nd (evening) to 25th July (noon) 2010 in the competitors' tent.

B) GROOMS

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC. All grooms of horses being started in the CSI will receive meals free of charge from 22nd July (evening) to 25th July (noon) 2010. There will be only a limited number of accommodation for grooms, which has to be reserved with the entries.

C) HORSES

A maximum of four boxes may be reserved per rider. The horses will be stabled free of charge (1st bedding included) in mobile boxes in a tent from 22nd to 25th July 2010. Only boxes are available for horses participating in the event. The required number of boxes must be ordered with the entries. **No boxes can be claimed unless they were ordered in advance.** Costs for waste disposal: 30,- EUR per box (incl. VAT). Extra costs for shavings. Cost for the boxes per extra horse: 140,- EUR incl. VAT. The competitor himself has to take care of fodder and bedding. However, forage and straw as well as shavings may be bought at prices of the day on site.

Only the assigned stables are allowed to be used. Mangers have to be brought along. For current supply a fee of 60,- EUR incl. VAT will be levied. The OC grants no reimbursement of transport charges.

E) WELCOME

Arrival is possible as of Thursday, 22nd July, 2010, 8:00 a. m. Stables have to be cleared by Monday, 26th July, 2010, 10:00 a. m.

The time and date of arrival of athletes and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC to facilitate them on arrival.

F) LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS

Free transportation arrangements from the official show hotels to show grounds will be available from 22nd to 25th July, 2010.

G) ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES

The Athletes are authorized to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 135. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with Article 135 of the General Regulations.

All Riders & horses participating in any International competition must be registered with the FEI.

The fee will be payable at closing date of entries by means of a crossed cheque. Costs for current supply and forage will be invoiced in addition on site for all Athletes. 12,50 CHF per horse will be charged as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the Athlete or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

IMPORTANT - Entry forms must include the following information on

• Horses/Ponies:

Name of horse/pony, passport number, stud-book initials, date of birth, country of birth, breed, sex, colour, name(s) of owner(s), s), FEI horse registration number

• Athletes:

Name of athlete, date of birth of Athlete, nationality of athlete, FEI athlete registration number

Entries without this information will be rejected.

For German Athletes only the German Athletes cheques are permitted with valid horse stickers or German Athletes may enter through the German online system (NeOn).

Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to, Late entries or alterations will only be accepted on consultation with the OC.

The number and kind of the boxes needed (incl. date of arrival and departure) as well as the number of needed electricity etc. have to be given with the entries. If the entries do not include any information with regard number of boxes and/or electricity, the OC reserves one box per horse entered. The costs have to be paid without fail on settlement of accounts.

1. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

Athletes who need health papers for their horses for leaving the country, have to inform the OC by closing date of definitive entries, otherwise no papers may be issued. For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 35,00 EUR per horse.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.

b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 12th Edition, effective 5th April 2010

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009, updated 1st January 2010:

Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 6 months + 21 days after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).

2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).

3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to have the prize giving ceremonies at a later time. The 8 best riders have to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of each competition.

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 6).

3. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income tax amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

4. INSURANCES

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

5. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, Athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER (, the Chefs d'Equipe) and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Entry right to showgrounds will be handed out to competitors, one partner per competitor, one groom per competitor and per participating horse two owners (max. 2 horses per competitor acc. to FEI-passport). The names of the above mentioned persons have to be given through the competitor to the OC before the event has begun. This rule applies to competitors of the international competitions 1 – 9.

8. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
